## *“Reconnect with God this Advent”*

*“And you, my child, will be called a prophet of the Most High; for you will go on before the Lord to prepare the way for him, to give his people the knowledge of salvation through the forgiveness of their sins, because of the tender mercy of our God, by which the rising sun will come to us from heaven to shine on those living in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the path of peace.” -Zechariah speaking about John the Baptist  
(Luke 1:76-79)*

As December rolls around, we enter the season of Advent, a time of waiting for Christ, both anticipating the celebration of Christmas and remembering Jesus' promise to come back. It's traditionally a time of preparation to be ready to meet the Lord: we remember the cry of John the Baptist in the desert, calling all to repent of their sins and become ready to receive the Messiah. While we know that Jesus has already come, we may have accepted him as Lord and Savior, through the course of life we can all become disconnected from God's presence.

Advent is a time to reconnect with the Lord, especially if you are feeling adrift in loneliness, pain, or the many challenges of life. Advent is a time to tend to our souls, to mind where they are injured and restless, seeking the healing presence of God.

Will you reconnect with God this Advent?

Will you tend to the healing of your soul, as the Spirit leads you to wait on Christ?

There is no one-size-fits-all way to do this, but let me offer you some suggestions:

- *Embrace silence.* Sometimes our restlessness comes from our lack of holy rest. Separate some time each day, or as often as you can, to sit quietly in silent prayer, waiting for the Lord to meet you.
- *Rediscover the Christmas story.* We can get so wrapped up in the outward celebrations of Christmas, we forget to be fed by the Spirit through the story of Christ coming into the world. I invite you to read these chapters: Matthew 1-3, Luke 1-3, & John 1, and/or use the daily Advent Devotional by Advent Conspiracy. This 25 day devotional has been emailed to our mass mailing list, been uploaded to our website, and if electronic resources are not your thing, we can print out a copy for you at the office for \$3 (cost of paper and ink).
- *Spend time and resources intentionally.* With so many events all around, it is easy to be pulled in many directions this season, and not feel like we are fully present for any of it. This can contribute to our sense of disconnection from God and one another. Remember you don't need to attend every possible event, or be part of every seasonal effort. Choose those you really feel called to attend and engage fully. Christmas is also not about expensive presents, or fancy decorations. You can go all out if you have the means and it gives you joy (and you know it will give others joy) but remember that simple can be precious. Some reminders of your love for your loved ones can go a long way. Your kindness and presence can be the best gifts.

- **Give lovingly.** Giving gifts at Christmas has always been a part of expressing God's love for others and the world. Gifts do not need to cost money (some of the best gifts I've ever received have been heartfelt letters and assurances), but if you have the means to spend money, don't be pressured to give by obligation or social standard. Let love lead you. Give presents with meaning. Give to charities intentionally, mindful of the difference it will make in the lives of those receiving the gift. Give from a sense of thanks and hope. Enjoy it.
- **Worship with others.** Our worship services this season anticipate the coming of Christ, helping us reflect on the gift of Christ's presence. If you haven't been to church in a while, or you'd like to spend more time in worship, join us for any or all of our Advent and Christmas Services:
  - **First Sunday** in Advent: 11/30 at 10:30 am. We begin the lighting of the **Advent Candles**. We are also **receiving new members** into the church!
  - **Second Sunday** in Advent: 12/7 at 10:30 am. Join us for **communion**!
  - **Third Sunday** in Advent: 12/14 at 10:30 am. **Children's Program** with fellowship afterwards!
  - **Fourth Sunday** in Advent: 12/21 at 10:30 am. **Christmas Cantata** by the Chancel Choir.
  - Christmas Eve: On December 24th we celebrate the birth of the Savior during our **Candlelight Christmas Eve Service at 10:30 pm.** (If your family prefers an earlier service, please join Middle Creek Presbyterian Church on 12473 Montague Road for their Christmas Eve service at 4:00 pm).

I'll be praying for all of you to have a particularly hope-filled season this year, blessed by the light of Christ. If you are struggling more than usual, please do not hesitate to reach out to me as pastor, or to any trusted friends or leaders in the church, for help. We have been given the gift of this community of faith, and we will be living into our calling through loving one another.

## Rural County Ride Program

Deacons want to let all members and friends know this service is available through the county.

- Monday - Friday 6 am - 6 pm (except holidays)
- Shopping-3 rides per month to Rockford. (Dates are predetermined-so book early)
- Out of town rides(medical) require 2 days for reservation. (Cost is .35 per mile)
- Wheelchair lift is available, and there is no charge for an aide or someone to accompany.
- One person may accompany
- Rates vary from \$1-\$2 one way. (Cost is .35 per mile may apply depending on location). Older adults, veterans, and those with disabilities the fares are capped \$5 one way and \$10 round trip


